

**PRESS RELEASE** *Amsterdam/'s-Hertogenbosch, the Netherlands, 20 February 2020***Van Lanschot Kempen launches share buy-back programme to fund remuneration policy and share plans**

On 20 February 2020, Van Lanschot Kempen will start the repurchase of up to 150,000 of its own shares (depository receipts for Class A ordinary shares). At the closing price of 19 February 2020, the programme will cost €3.0 million. It will serve to cover the depository receipts to be allocated to employees under the existing remuneration policy and share plans.

The share buy-back programme will end on the day before the publication of Van Lanschot Kempen's 2020 annual figures, or sooner if the maximum number of repurchased shares is reached before then. Van Lanschot Kempen has tasked ING with the implementation of its share buy-back programme. ING will make its trading decisions independently of Van Lanschot Kempen.
